

TITLE I PROGRAM

Title I is a program funded by the Federal Government designed to serve students in the schools that meet low income eligibility requirements. Once a school is eligible for Title I funding, any child in the school exhibiting academic need (especially in the areas of reading, writing, and math) can be served by specially trained teachers in pull-out or in-class settings.

A high degree of parent involvement is included in the Title I program. Policy 302 ensures that parents are involved in developing the policy, annual meetings are held for all Title I parents in their respective schools, and communication is ongoing between the home and school. An annual end-of-year evaluation is made for the content and effectiveness of the Title I parental involvement program.
